- 3. Increase stitch
- 4. Decrease stitch
- 5. Eyelet stitch

Foundation Row:

Cast on 101 stitches onto your size 3 (3.25 mm) knitting needles.

Row 1 (Right side):

Purl all 101 stitches.

Row 2 (Wrong side):

Knit all 101 stitches.

Repeat Rows 1 and 2 for 3 more rows.

Row 7 (Right side):

• Knit 1, increase 1 stitch (knit into the front and then the back loop of the next stitch),knit 15; repeat from * to * across the row, ending knit 1.

Rows 8-11:

Repeat Rows 1 and 2.

Row 12 (Right side):

Knit 2, increase 1 stitch, purl 11; repeat from * to * across the row, ending knit 2.

Rows 13-19:

Repeat Rows 1 and 2.

Row 20 (Right side):

Knit 3, increase 1 stitch, purl 9; repeat from * to * across the row, ending knit 3.

Rows 21-27:

Repeat Rows 1 and 2.

Row 28 (Right side):

Knit 4, increase 1 stitch, purl 7; repeat from * to * across the row, ending knit 4.

Rows 29-35:

Repeat Rows 1 and 2.

Row 36 (Right side):

Knit 5, increase 1 stitch, purl 5; repeat from * to * across the row, ending knit 5.

Rows 37-43:

Repeat Rows 1 and 2.

Row 44 (Right side):

 Knit 6, increase 1 stitch, purl 3; repeat from * to * across the row, ending knit 6.

Row 45-49:

Repeat Rows 1 and 2.

Row 50 (Right side):

Knit 7, increase 1 stitch, purl 1; repeat from * to * across the row, ending knit 7.

Rows 51-53:

Repeat Rows 1 and 2.

Eyelet Rows:

Rows 54-55 (Right side):

Knit across all stitches.

Row 56 (Wrong side):

Purl across all stitches.

Row 57 (Right side):

Knit 1, knit 2 together, yarn over, knit 2 together, repeat from * to * across the row, ending knit 1.

Rows 58-61:

Repeat Rows 1 and 2.

Repeat Eyelet Rows 54-61 for a total of 5 times.

Scalloped Edging:

Row 62 (Right side):

 Knit 1, knit 2 together, purl 3 together; repeat from * to * across the row, ending knit 1.

Row 63:

Purl across all stitches.

Rows 64-66 (Right side):

Repeat Row 62.

Finishing:

- 1. Bind off all stitches loosely.
- 2. Weave in any loose ends.
- 3. Measure the width of your knitted piece and divide by 2. This measurement will be used to determine the center point.
- 4. Mark the center point on one end of the knitted piece.
- 5. Fold the knitted piece in half lengthwise, matching the center points.
- 6. Sew the two sides together with a mattress stitch, starting at the center and working your way outward.
- 7. Insert the cover into your Moses basket and admire your beautiful creation.
- 1. If you're a beginner, practice the eyelet stitch on a small swatch of yarn before starting the cover.
- 2. Use a stitch marker to keep track of the center point of the cover.
- 3. If you want a larger cover, you can continue increasing stitches after Row 53 to reach the desired width.
- 4. If you want a shorter cover, you can reduce the number of eyelet rows after Row 53.


5. Be sure to check the fit of the cover on your Moses basket before binding off the stitches.

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
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
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
