






Jim Endersby hybridizing orchids in his greenhouse





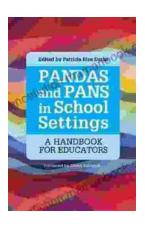
