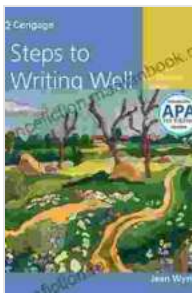

Formatting Citations

The basic format of an APA citation includes the author's name, the year of publication, and the title of the work. For example:

Smith, J. (2020). *The psychology of writing.* New York: Oxford U

If the work has more than one author, list all of the authors' names in the citation. For example:

Jones, M., Smith, J., & Brown, K. (2020). *The psychology of writing*.

If the work has no author, begin the citation with the title of the work. For example:

The psychology of writing. (2020). New York: Oxford University

In-Text Citations

In-text citations are used to indicate where you have used information from another source in your writing. In-text citations should be placed at the end of the sentence or paragraph where you have used the information. The in-text citation should include the author's last name and the year of publication. For example:

According to Smith (2020), the psychology of writing is a complex process.

If the work has more than one author, use the first author's last name followed by "et al." in the in-text citation. For example:

According to Jones et al. (2020), the psychology of writing is a complex process.

If the work has no author, use the title of the work in the in-text citation. For example:

According to *The psychology of writing* (2020), the psychology of writing is a complex process.

Reference List

The reference list is a list of all the sources that you have cited in your writing. The reference list should be placed at the end of your document. The reference list should be double-spaced and should be arranged alphabetically by author's last name. For example:

Jones, M., Smith, J., & Brown, K. (2020). *The psychology of writing*.

Updates in APA 7th Edition

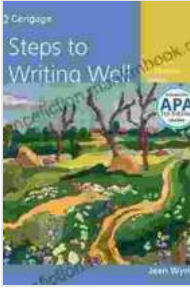
The APA 7th Edition style includes a number of updates from the previous edition. Some of the most important updates include:

- The use of italics for book titles has been eliminated.
- The use of quotation marks for article titles has been eliminated.
- The use of "p." for page numbers has been eliminated.
- The use of "et al." has been changed to "and others" in the in-text citation when there are more than three authors.
- The use of "" has been added to the reference list for electronic sources.

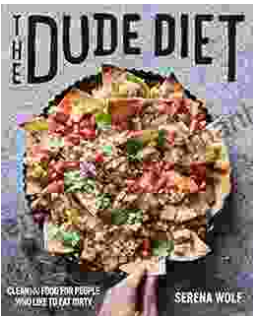

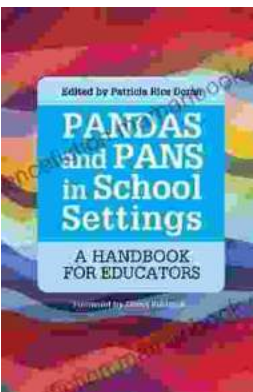
