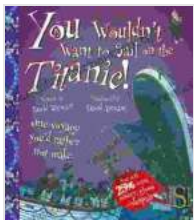


You Wouldn't Want to Sail on the Titanic, and You Wouldn't Want to Be...

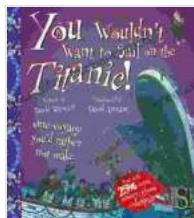

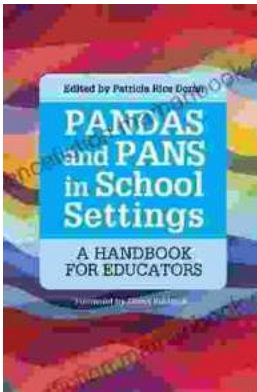
